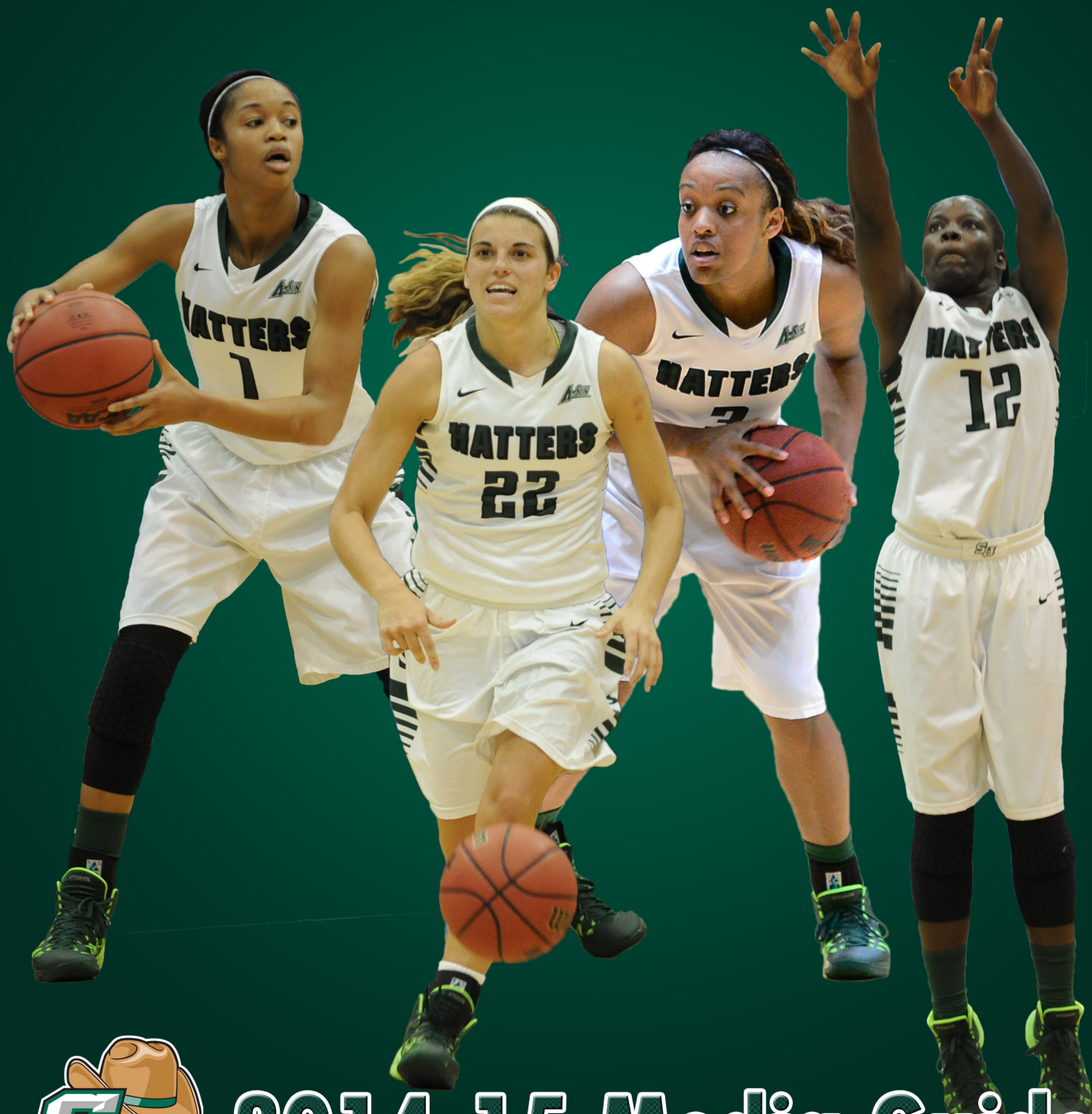

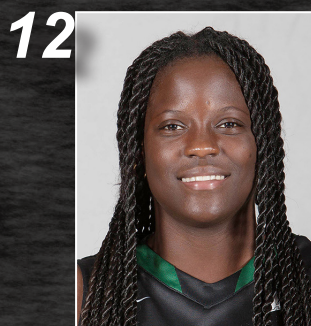

Broadcast Information

For the first time ever, the Stetson women's basketball program will be featured on TV a minimum of 19 times during the regular season, including all 13 home games. As part of the Atlantic Sun's E3 On-Campus Initiative, Stetson University will broadcast all men's and women's home basketball games via ESPN3 and the WatchESPN app for mobile devices.

Robbie Aaron, Director of Broadcasting and Media Relations for the Daytona Cubs, will serve as the play-by-play announcer for all home television broadcasts. Aaron has served as the radio play-by-play voice for the Hatters men's basketball team for the past two seasons, and he has five years of broadcast experience in professional baseball.

Aaron's broadcast partner will be coaching veteran Dee Romine. Romine coached college basketball for over 24 seasons including 15 years at Stetson University. Romine helped guide Stetson to its first ever NCAA Tournament appearance in 2005. She also been a part of Atlantic Sun and regional television broadcasts since her retirement from coaching in 2008.

The Hatters will also return for their third season on WSBB radio, 1230 AM in Daytona and New Smyrna Beach, 1490 AM in DeLand, online at myam1230.com, and via the free WSBB app for mobile devices.

For the second straight season, Ryan Rouse will serve as the radio play-by-play voice for the Hatters. Rouse has also been the voice of Stetson baseball for the past three seasons in addition to serving in a play-by-play role for men's and women's soccer and volleyball matches.

His partner will be Despina Barton, a reporter for Bright House Sports Networks. Barton spent time as an Associate Producer with Ivanhoe Broadcast News, part of the Production Team with FoxSports Florida covering the Orlando Magic and as a freelancer worked with ESPN, TNT, and NBA Entertainment on various national events.

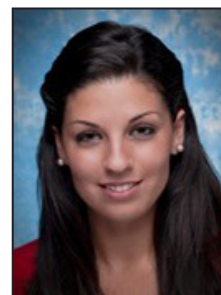

2014-15 Season Outlook

Throughout the past four seasons, the Stetson Hatters have proven to be a powerhouse in the Atlantic Sun Conference. With four straight 20+ win seasons, two conference championships, and four postseason appearances including two in the NCAA tournament, the women's basketball program has established a culture of success. The team has raised the bar year-after-year, breaking the school record for victories in each of the past three seasons:

Fresh off a record 27-win season including the program's first NCAA postseason victory, the Hatters are primed to have another successful campaign in 2014-15.

Stetson will have to move forward without its all-time leading scorer and shot-blocker Sasha Sims, who wrapped up a remarkable four-year career last season. However, the team returns eight letterwinners and five starters from a squad that scored points at a blistering pace. Overall, the Hatters averaged 79.3 points per game, the 19th highest total in the NCAA and the highest mark in school history since 1988-89. Stetson topped 80 points a school-record 17 times, 90 points nine times and 100 points three times.

Stetson's success came despite having a relatively young squad which included five freshmen and six newcomers. The group gelled together quickly and produced a record 16-game winning streak during conference play.

With most of the team returning this season, the Hatters will be led by a veteran group of players, including a strong corps of four seniors.

Jama Sharp flourished in her first season as the team's point guard, averaging 11.7 points, 5.2 assists, and 2.4 steals per game en route to first team all-

conference honors. She was a threat from long range as well, knocking down 52 three-pointers in 140 attempts.

Cherisse Burris completed another strong season in the post, averaging 10.1 points and 7.3 rebounds per contest. She shot over 50 percent for the season and was named to the Atlantic Sun all-tournament team.

C.J. Coddington made huge strides her junior season, averaging 8.2 points and 4.3 rebounds per game. She ranked second the team in assists (85) and steals (54) and often gave the team a boost of energy when she was on the court.

Myeisha Hall sat out the first semester due to NCAA transfer rules, but once she became eligible, the Hatters took off. Hall played a key role in her very first game, an 83-81 victory over Charlotte, which began a 19-1 stretch for the Hatters. For the season, the West Palm Beach native averaged 8.2 points and 4.5 rebounds per game and drained 31 three-pointers.

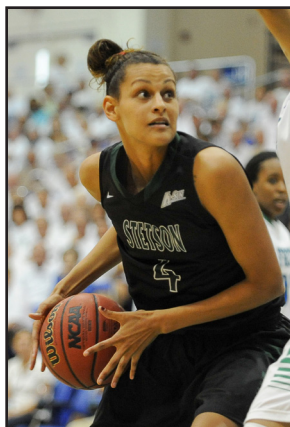

Amber Porter and Brianti Saunders produced the top two scoring seasons by Hatter freshmen in school history. Porter (484 points) and Saunders (447 points) each played in all 35 games and also ranked as the top two scoring freshmen in the conference.

The 6-foot-3 Porter did most of her damage in the post, knocking down short jumpers, lay-ups, and free throws to help lead the offense. She was a tremendous force on defense as well, racking up a school-record 129 blocks on the season. That marked the second-highest total in conference history and the fifth highest total by a freshman in NCAA history.

Saunders, meanwhile, used her quickness and brilliant ball-handling skills to break down opposing defenders. She ranked among the league leaders in scoring (12.8) and assists (2.4) and had the top free throw percentage in the A-Sun among players with over 100 attempts (.824). She scored a season-high 30 points at FAMU on Dec. 2.

DeAsia Beal provided quality minutes off the bench while gaining valuable experience her freshman year. She averaged 1.7 points and 1.2 rebounds per game while playing in 27 games.

Aisha Turner joins Stetson by way of Clemson University, where she averaged 6.7 points, 3.5 assists and 2.6 rebounds per game her freshman season. A midyear transfer in 2013-14, Turner will add depth to the Hatters backcourt when she becomes eligible following the first semester.

A pair of freshmen - Keevana Edwards and Sarah Sagerer - will each look to make an immediate impact on the Hatters program.

Edwards will add depth to the forward position. A native of Atlanta, Edwards helped lead Wesleyan to a 27-4 record and a berth in the Class AA state championship game.

At 6-3, Sagerer will join Porter as the two tallest players on the squad. In addition to helping the Hatters in the paint, the Austria native can also hit from behind the arc.

Alexandra Ciabattani and Jo Paine each transferred from four-year institutions and will have to sit out the 2014-15 season due to transfer rules. Ciabattani was the Heartland Conference Player of the Year for Newman University in 2013-14. She averaged a league-best 20.3 points per game. Paine, meanwhile, averaged 10.3 points and 4.9 rebounds as a rookie at Santa Clara University, earning her a spot on the West Coast Conference all-freshman team.

Looking to build off last year's record-setting season, the Hatters have their sights set on a third Atlantic Sun Championship in a five-year span. With a strong veteran corps returning, a group of talented newcomers, an explosive offensive attack and one of the top shot blockers in the nation, one thing is for certain - the Hatters are poised for another successful season in 2014-15.

A three-time Atlantic Sun Conference champion as a head coach, Lynn Bria enters her seventh season at the helm of Stetson women's basketball program.

Over the past four seasons Bria has turned the Hatters into a formidable force in the Atlantic Sun. She has guided the Hatters to two conference titles, two NCAA Tournament appearances, two WNIT bids, and four consecutive 20+ win seasons. In fact, Stetson is just one of two schools in the state of Florida to post as many as 94 victories since the start of the 2010-11 season.

In 2013-14 and for the third year in a row, the Hatters set a school-record for most victories in a single-season with 27. Stetson also won a school-record 16 conference games and won a school-record 16 consecutive contests during the regular season. The Hatters also earned their second-ever bid to the WNIT and the program's first-ever NCAA postseason victory, a 70-63 win at Miami on Mar. 20. Stetson had three players named First Team All-Conference, including A-Sun Freshman of the Year Amber Porter.

The 2012-13 season was one for the history books as the Hatters set numerous team records for success and captured their second A-Sun title in the past three seasons. Bria helped lead the Hatters to a school-record 24 wins overall, a 12-1 record at home, a school-record 14 wins in conference play, and winning streaks of 11 straight overall and 16 in a row at home. In the A-Sun Championship game, Stetson rallied from a 15-point second-half deficit to defeat top-seeded and previously undefeated FGCU 70-64, and then earned their highest-ever NCAA Tournament seed (14) and an appearance in the Columbus, Ohio regional against UCLA.

In 2011-12, the Hatters won a school record 23 games and advanced to the postseason for the second year in a row, participating in the WNIT for the first time in school history. Three players earned All-Atlantic Sun honors including A-Sun Player of the Year and All-Tournament Team selection Victoria McGowan, who led the nation with three triple-doubles. Also honored were Second

Team All-Atlantic Sun forward Sasha Sims and A-Sun All-Freshman Team forward Cherisse Burris.

Bria's 2010-11 Hatters won 20 games for the first time in 10 seasons, captured their third Atlantic Sun Conference tournament championship and advanced to the NCAA Tournament for the second time in school history and first time since 2005.

Stetson's turnaround under Bria from 6-24 to 20-13 (+12.5 games) was the second largest improvement in NCAA Division I women's basketball. Honors that came to members of the team included A-Sun Tournament MVP (Victoria McGowan), A-Sun All-Tournament Team (Tierra Brown, Sasha Sims), Second Team All-Atlantic Sun (McGowan), A-Sun All-Freshman Team (Sims),





A-Sun Player of the Week (Natasha Graboski) and A-Sun Newcomer of the Week (McGowan twice, Sims). Graboski went on to sign a professional contract with Alexandria of Romania's Division 1 League in the summer of 2011.

In 2009-10 Bria led the Hatters to their seventh consecutive A-Sun tournament appearance. The highlight of the season was a December 16 victory over USC Upstate, which would go on to finish as a 20-win team, that led to forward Jessica Conner receiving A-Sun Player of the Week honors.

In her first season at Stetson, Bria coached the Hatters to eight victories, including the program's first victory against an RPI Top 100 opponent (FGCU, 12/4/08) in the 10 years since online data has been kept. She also made an immediate impact on the recruiting trail as her 2009-10 incoming class was ranked by Michael T. White's noted scouting service All-Star Girls Report as the best in the Atlantic Sun Conference and in the top third of all NCAA Division I teams.

Bria has coached women's basketball for 20 years with 14 seasons of Division I head coaching experience to her credit at UCF, Ohio University and Stetson. In addition to coaching, she has extensive classroom experience at the university level and is committed to developing young women both athletically and academically.

Prior to joining the Hatters, Bria spent the previous two seasons as an assistant coach at top-level programs West Virginia (2006-07) and most recently the University of Miami. Her excellent recruiting skills led to the Hurricanes signing a Top 25 incoming class according to recruiting experts at HoopGurlz.com. With WVU, Bria served as recruiting coordinator in addition to her on-court coaching duties. Her leadership helped the Mountaineers achieve one of their best seasons in school history, which featured an at-large bid to and second round appearance

in the NCAA Tournament as well as the second-largest turnaround in W-L record in Big East Conference history (15-16 to 21-11 overall and from 4-12 to 11-5 in Big East games).

From 1999-2006, Bria was the head coach at Ohio University in Athens, Ohio. She is second all-time in career wins at Ohio and was the first coach in Bobcats history to sign a recruit that would become Mid-American Conference Freshman of the Year. Bria's first-year players earned MAC All-Freshman honors three consecutive years; only seven other players in the 20+ year history of the program had done that. In addition to coaching, Bria also taught a class in the Education department.

Prior to taking the position at Ohio, Bria led old Stetson nemesis UCF for three seasons from 1996-99. Her final Golden Knights team in 1998-99 was the TAAC (now Atlantic Sun) regular season and tournament champions and appeared in the NCAA Tournament. Bria's first head coaching position came at Division II Texas Woman's University in Denton, Texas for three seasons from 1993-96. In her first two seasons with the Hatters, Brown has helped guide Stetson to its two winningest seasons in school history, a 24-9 mark in 2012-13 and a 27-8 record in 2013-14. 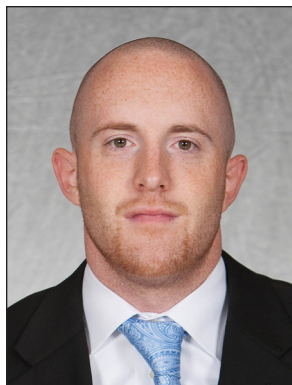

David Saur is in his second season as an assistant coach and recruiting coordinator at Stetson University.

In Saur's first season with the program, Stetson set school-records for overall wins (27), conference wins (16) and longest winning streak (16). The Hatters also posted their first-ever NCAA postseason win, a 70-63 victory over Miami in the first round of the WNIT.

As one of the nation's youngest recruiting coordinators, Saur's first recruiting class with the Hatters saw him put together the #69 Recruiting Class in the country (first in the Atlantic Sun), according to the All-Star Girl's Report.

In addition to his recruiting duties, Saur mentored the post players, including A-Sun Freshman of the Year Amber Porter and first team all-conference performers Sasha Sims and Porter. Sims and Porter ranked no. 1 and no. 2 on the team in scoring and blocked shots. Porter posted the highest single-season blocks total in school history (129) and the fifth highest blocks total for a freshman in NCAA history.

Saur previously served in a similar position at Indiana University of Pennsylvania (IUP), where in 2012-13 he helped lead the Hawks to a 23-9 record, an appearance in the NCAA Tournament, and a #12 national ranking. As the posts coach, he mentored forward Sarah Pastorek, an honorable mention All-American performer, and forward Lindsay Stamp, an NCAA Tournament Atlantic Region all-tournament team selection. As the recruiting coordinator, he helped secure a Division I transfer prior to the start of the 2012-13 season.

Saur also served as an assistant coach and recruiting coordinator at California University of Pennsylvania in 2011-12. As recruiting coordinator, he secured a commitment from a Division I transfer. As the guards coach, he mentored first-team all-conference selections Danielle Luckett and Amy Johns.

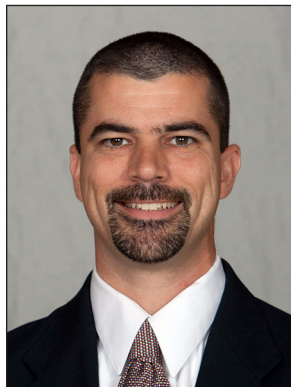

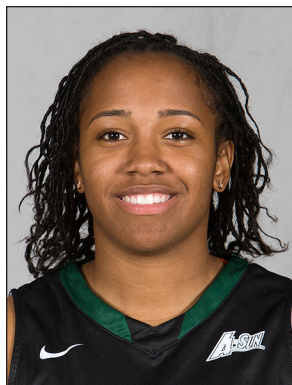

- ▶ Head coach Lynn Bria earned her 250th career victory and her 100th victory at Stetson.
- ▶ Jama Sharp were named to the Academic Conference Scholar List for maintaining a cumulative GPA of better than 3.4.

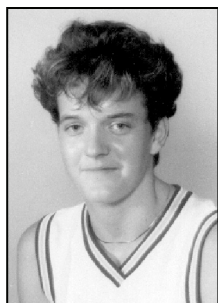

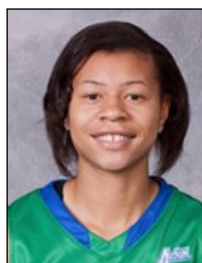

Facilities

Stetson University was founded in DeLand in 1883, and the 175-acre DeLand campus is listed on the National Register of Historic Places. Recent improvements to the DeLand campus include:

- addition of a coffeehouse in the Carlton Union Building (completed),
- renovation of Nemec Hall into pet-friendly housing (completed),

Within the past nine years:

- a softball training facility was added at Patricia Wilson Field,
- 5 fraternity houses were renovated,
- 6 residential halls were built, 5 of which feature apartment-style living.

Faculty

The DeLand campus has 257 full-time faculty members, 93 percent of whom hold Ph.D. or equivalent degrees and who teach undergraduate classes. Our student/faculty ratio is 12-to-1.

Student Body

Stetson's 2,841 undergraduates come from 43 states and 47 foreign countries; 56 percent of undergraduates are female and 44 percent are male.

Study Abroad

Stetson University students may study in other countries for a few weeks to a full semester. Faculty-led programs take place in Austria, Brazil, England, France, Germany, Guatemala, Hong Kong, mainland China, Mexico, Russia, Scotland and Spain. Certain School of Business Administration classes and programs include an overseas component to such locations as Hong Kong, Vietnam, Malaysia, South Africa, New Zealand and Australia.

Athletics

Stetson is a member of the NCAA Division I Atlantic Sun Conference and offers 18 intercollegiate sports: football, baseball, softball, volleyball, sand volleyball, men and women's basketball, men's and women's tennis, men's and women's golf, rowing, cross country, men's and women's soccer, and women's lacrosse. The non-scholarship football program will be part of the Pioneer Football League and played its first games in the fall of 2013. The university also has a vibrant Club Sports program featuring Aikido, baseball, basketball, croquet, dance, equestrian, men's and women's lacrosse, shooting, skydive, men's and women's soccer, softball, surf, tennis, ultimate frisbee, and volleyball.

Student Life

The DeLand campus alone is home to more than 110 student organizations, including service and special interest groups, student government, social fraternities and sororities, and 18 scholastic and honorary societies including Omicron Delta Kappa, Phi Beta Kappa and Alpha Kappa Psi.

Admission

Stetson seeks students with a challenging high school curriculum. The Fall 2013 incoming freshmen class had an average 3.86 GPA and SAT averages of 577 for Math, 584 for Reading, and 562 for Writing.

Stetson University entered a new era of leadership in July 2009 when Dr. Wendy B. Libby became the university's ninth president. With a broad career in higher education and private industry, she is building on Stetson's values-centered heritage and tradition of academic excellence and community engagement.

Libby is leading a comprehensive strategic plan focusing innovation to drive Stetson from success to significance – through reinforcement of academic excellence, establishment of a Student Success program, campus infrastructure improvements and growth in recruitment and retention. She spearheaded a major landscaping and classroom improvement project and development of a DeLand Campus Plan as a guide for future growth. She has taken a progressive approach to residential life at Stetson, including introduction of pet-friendly residence halls and purchase of an apartment complex for student housing.

Athletics has grown dramatically under her leadership. Along with Director of Athletics Jeff Altier, Libby was integral in bringing football back to Stetson for the first time since 1956. Coming with the return of football was the construction of a \$6.7 million, 25,000-square foot athletic training facility, which opened in August, 2012. Other additions include Division I women's lacrosse and sand volleyball programs, a robust Club Sports program, and a cooperative effort with the city of DeLand to renovate Spec Martin Stadium for the return of Hatter Football in 2013.

Dr. Libby is active in Central Florida life and, in 2010, was appointed to the Mainstreet Community Bank Board of Directors. She is an honorary member of the Rotary Club of DeLand and is a Paul Harris Fellow. In 2011 and 2013, Dr. Libby was named to The *Volusia/Flagler Business Report's* list of "Influential Women in Business." In 2014, she received a Women Who Mean Business Award from the *Orlando Business Journal* and was also named one of the "Top 55 Most Influential" in Volusia and Flagler counties by MyCoast Magazine.

Libby served as president of Stephens College in Columbia, Mo., from 2003-09, and as vice president for business affairs and chief financial officer at Furman University, Greenville, S.C., from 1995 to 2003. Her administrative and teaching experience in higher education began in 1980 at institutions including Westbrook College (now part of the University of New England), the University of Hartford, the University of Connecticut Health Center, The Ohio State University and Cornell University.

A native of Brooklyn, N.Y., Libby earned her doctorate in Educational Administration from the University of Connecticut in 1994. Her undergraduate degree, in Biology with a concentration in Genetics, is from Cornell University. She earned an MBA, with a concentration in Finance, from Cornell's Johnson Graduate School of Management.

In honor of her outstanding leadership, Libby received the 2007 Athena Award from the Columbia (Mo.) Chamber of Commerce Women's Network for her support of women in realizing their full leadership potential.

She and her husband, Dr. Richard M. Libby, a former college president, have two sons, Glenn and wife Ginger, and Gregg and wife Lori, four grandchildren, a great-granddaughter, and two Labrador Retrievers. An avid reader, she enjoys cooking and entertaining.

Stetson, 1982

18th Year

Jeff Altier, a 30-year veteran of the Stetson University athletic department, is in his 18th year as Director of Athletics. During his tenure, Altier has earned a reputation as an outstanding fundraiser and a leader with an eye on the future, and is noted for his active participation in the NCAA governance structure.

Altier, captain of the nationally-ranked 1982 Hatter baseball team, earned both his bachelor's and master's degrees from Stetson. Upon wrapping up his Stetson baseball career, he spent two years as a player/coach developing the sport in Perth, Australia. He then returned to Stetson as an assistant coach before being promoted to Ticket Manager, Director of Athletic Promotions, and then Associate Athletic Director. In these rolls, he spearheaded the department's development efforts as well as oversaw athletic marketing and promotions, concessions and travel coordination. He was named Director of Athletics in 1996.

Altier also served as Tournament Manager for the NCAA Division I Southeast First and Second Round Men's basketball tournament hosted by Stetson in 1993 and 1996 at the Orlando Arena, and as Tournament Director for the 1999, 2004, and 2014 tournament.

Stetson has taken great strides in the area of gender equity under Altier, increasing scholarships, participation opportunities and staffing for women's athletics. The unprecedented success of the women's tennis, golf, soccer, basketball and softball teams in conference competition during Altier's tenure are evidence of his commitment to women's athletics. In fact, under his direction Stetson's women's and men's teams have won an impressive 15 conference championships.

A hallmark of Altier's professional career was the building of Stetson's \$4.5 million baseball facility, Melching Field at Conrad Park. Built in conjunction with the City of DeLand, Melching Field is regarded as one of the nation's premiere college baseball facilities. Altier then turned his attention to construction of an on-campus softball facility, which broke ground in 2002 and was ready

for competition in February of 2003. Patricia Wilson Field has been named Collegiate Softball Field of the Year six times. He was also instrumental in securing new state-of-the-art field lighting for both the softball and soccer fields in 2005. Under his guidance, the Athletic Department has also seen the addition of the Wilson Athletic Center, a \$ 1.5 million health and wellness facility for the use of Stetson student-athletes.

Stetson athletics has continued to grow under Altier's guidance. Three new sports have recently been added - sand volleyball started competition in the spring of 2012, while women's lacrosse will start in the spring of 2013 and football will return in the fall of 2013. The program is also growing in terms of staffing and facilities, with construction complete on the \$6.7 million, 25,000 square-foot Athletic Training Facility that houses offices, locker rooms, and sports medicine facilities for the football, women's lacrosse, and men's and women's soccer programs.

Altier's leadership has extended beyond campus, as he has taken on Atlantic Sun Conference leadership roles, chairing many committees and serving as conference vice-president. Additionally, he has served on the National Association of College Directors of Athletics Division IAAA board of directors, the NCAA A.E.C. Cabinet and is currently a member of the prestigious NCAA Leadership Council. Locally he has served as president of the DeLand Rotary Club, vice-president of the DeLand Sports Redevelopment Association, and is a graduate of Leadership DeLand and Leadership Orlando. He is currently a member of the board of directors of the Central Florida Sports Commission. Altier was honored as the West Volusia Sports person of the Year for 2004. In 2011 Altier was recognized by his peers in the National Association of Collegiate Director of Athletics as the Under Armour Southeast Region Division I Athletic Director of the Year.

Altier's family includes wife, Sarah (Booker) (Stetson B.A. '82, M.Ed. '96), and children Heath (Stetson M.B.A. '09), Brianne, and Garrett.



The Edmunds Center



The Stetson women's basketball team has called the J. Ollie Edmunds Center home since 1975, and the Hatters have won over 275 games in their 39 years on their home court. Entering the 2014-15 season, the Hatters were 44-3 over their last 47 games at home, including a 14-1 home record in 2012-13 and 2013-14.

Also home to Stetson men's basketball and volleyball teams, the Edmunds Center houses coaches and staff offices, locker rooms, an equipment room, a ticket office, and a VIP suite.

The Edmunds Center was home to the men's 1991 and 1996 Trans America Athletic Conference Tournaments as well as the women's tournament in 1997. It also served as training camp site for the Orlando Magic of the National Basketball Association in 1992 and 1993, and hosted the NCAA Volleyball Tournament First Round in 1996.

The Hatters hosted and won a quarterfinal game of the 2014 Atlantic Sun Championship.

Sports Medicine

- The Stetson University Sports Medicine staff is under the direction of the head team physician, three associate physicians, and full-time certified athletic trainers providing a full complement of services to enhance the physical performance and personal healthcare of each student-athlete.
- The sports medicine staff is primarily located in the athletic training room of the Wilson Athletic Center. The athletic training room is a 2,500 square-foot facility dedicated to the healthcare of all student-athletes.
- The sports medicine staff is focused on identifying and preventing athletic injuries through the use of a complete line of evaluation tools including a state of the art isokinetic testing and rehabilitation device.

- The division of sports medicine utilizes a wide array of physicians, counselors, and other allied health care professionals to assist our student-athletes in all aspects of their healthcare, growth, and development.
- A full-time certified athletic trainer is on site for all in season practices, games, weight training, and conditioning sessions.
- The teams make full use of the 2,500 sq. ft. weight room located in the Wilson Athletic Center. The facility is stocked with over 9,000 pounds of free weights and selectorized equipment.
- Team members follow a comprehensive and individualized program designed to increase power, strength, speed, quickness, agility, jumping ability, flexibility and overall conditioning.

After spending more than three years away from the state of Florida, Longwood native Brad Lokey has returned home to serve as the Director of Strength and Conditioning at Stetson University.

A former member of the United States Marine Corps, Lokey oversees the strength and conditioning program for all 18 of Stetson's varsity sports. Lokey is a certified Strength and Conditioning Coach by the Collegiate Strength & Conditioning Coaches Association as well as by the National Strength & Conditioning Association. He is also certified as a personal trainer.

Lokey came to Stetson from Cumberland University in Tennessee where he was the Director of Strength & Conditioning. Before that, he spent six months working in the Georgia Tech Strength and Conditioning department – primarily working with the football, softball, swimming and diving and cheerleading squads for the Yellow Jackets.

Lokey was the first head Strength and Conditioning Coach and Fitness Center Manager at Webber International University in Babson Park, Fla., working in that position for two years. He was responsible for the 19-sport Warriors program, designing and implementing

workout programs for all sports, implementing and analyzing results to test the effectiveness of the programs and creating a computer data base for workouts for student-athletes.

Lokey was born in Shelbyville, Tenn., but grew up in Florida, graduating from Lyman High School in Longwood. He received his bachelor's degree in Recreational Administration with minors in Biology and Coaching from Central Methodist University in Fayette, Mo., in December of 2006. He earned a master's degree in Business Administration and Sport Management from Webber International in 2009.

Lokey is a member of the National Strength and Conditioning Association (NSCA) and Collegiate Strength and Conditioning Coaches Association (CSCCa). Lokey possesses three credentials from the NSCA including; Registered Strength & Conditioning Coach (RSCC), Certified Strength and Conditioning Specialist (CSCS) and Personal Trainer (CPT). He is also Strength & Conditioning Coach Certified (SCCC) and is recognized as an approved mentor by the CSCCa.

Adding an emphasis on sportsmanship in the competitive arena and fostering leadership opportunities through community service, the A-Sun, its member institutions and its student-athletes aim for an overall educational experience that is successful in Building Winners for Life.

BUILDING

The student-athletes of the A-Sun consistently achieve academic accolades on a national level ...

- Along with a myriad of sport-specific honors, four institutions and nine sports set record highs in the 2013-14 A-Sun All-Academic honors. More than 64 percent of the student-athletes in the A-Sun posted a 3.0 grade point average or better and four institutions recorded highs during the 2013-14 academic year, including the 78 percent of Lipscomb student-athletes honored as the Bisons claim this year's top honor.
- For the fifth-consecutive year more than 60 percent of the A-Sun's teams were honored, a first for the conference. Also for the second straight year at least three institutions eclipsed the 70 percent mark for All-Academic selections and also recorded new highs in their final percentages of student-athletes honored academically.
- In addition to the institutional highs, a total of nine sports also recorded percentage highs and five sports also turned in totals of at least 80 percent of the teams recording a 3.0 GPA or better.

WINNERS

... while performing at a high level in the competitive arena ...

- A conference record of four men's basketball teams earned invitations to postseason play with Mercer in the NCAA, FGCU in the NIT while ETSU and USC Upstate both earned spots in the CIT.
- With four women's basketball teams also making it to postseason play for the second-straight year, the A-Sun placed eight teams in postseason for the first time in conference history.
- Kennesaw State became only the second team in A-Sun history to reach the Super Regional Round.
- History was made as three A-Sun teams entered the NCAA Softball Regionals as all three squads; Lipscomb, USC Upstate and Stetson captured wins in the postseason.
- Men's golf also made A-Sun history as a record-setting four teams advanced to the NCAA Regionals.
- The 18 MLB Draft selections of A-Sun student-athletes are tied with last year's total, but the five picks within the first seven rounds are most in conference history.

...and at the same time preparing themselves to become valuable members of their community.

- A total of 84 A-Sun teams met or exceeded the most recent four-year Division I APR of 974. While all exceeded the standard APR multi-year average of 900, even when using the projected future APR multi-year standard of 930, 98 percent of the 155 A-Sun teams in the 2011-12 measure posted above the average.
- The ninth annual Atlantic Sun Student-Athlete Advisory Committee (SAAC) fundraising competition raised more than \$56,000 to benefit charities selected by the SAAC at each of the 10 A-Sun institutions. The total shatters the previous high mark of 22,209.68, set just last year.
- Six Atlantic Sun Conference member institutions were named to the 2012 President's Higher Education Community Service Honor Roll, two with distinction. That number places the A-Sun among the top half of Division I conferences, as only 12 of 31 conferences had six or more schools recognized.

Headquartered in Macon, Ga., the A-Sun footprint reaches into six of the top media markets in the Southeast. The A-Sun includes a blend of the most prestigious and dynamic private and public institutions in the region: Florida Gulf Coast University, Jacksonville University, Kennesaw State University, Lipscomb University, University of North Florida, Northern Kentucky University, University of South Carolina Upstate and Stetson University.

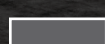
