News and Notes

Preview

The Stetson women's basketball team wraps up play in the Preseason WNIT Saturday as the Hatters take on North Carolina A&T. Tip-off is scheduled for 7 pm ET at the William R. Johnson Coliseum.

The All-Time Series vs. North Carolina A&T

North Carolina A&T leads the all-time series 2-0 over Stetson. The teams met in 2006 in Greensboro, N.C. (69-41 A&T) and in 2007 in DeLand (78-60 A&T).

Hatters Take On Conferences' Top Teams

Stetson has played the preseason favorite in both the Big 12 (Oklahoma) and Southland (Stephen F. Austin) Conferences. North Carolina was picked second in the Mid-Eastern Athletic Conference, and Monday's opponent, Indiana State, was picked to win the Missouri Valley Conference.

Stetson 84, Stephen F. Austin 77 - Recap

In a high-scoring, fast-paced game that had a flavor of postseason play, Stetson nailed down its first win of the season Friday with a 84-77 victory over host Stephen F. Austin. Sasha Sims led five Hatters in double figures with 23 points as Stetson (1-1) advanced to play North Carolina A&T at 7 p.m. Saturday night. Jama Sharp scored 14 points and added a career-high 10 assists for her second career double-double. Cherisse Burris (13 points), Amber Porter (12 points), and Brianti Saunders (10 points) also reached double figures.

Getting to the Line

Stetson has done a good job of getting to the free throw line this season. Stetson went 18-for-21 (85.7%) at Oklahoma and 26-for-39 (66.7%) at Stephen F. Austin.

Great Start for Amber Porter

Freshman Amber Porter made her first career start on Friday against Stephen F. Austin and in the first 1:44 of the game, she went 3-for-3 from the floor, and two offensive rebounds and one block on the defensive end.

Sasha Sims Leading the Team

As the lone senior on the team, Sasha Sims will be looked to lead both on and off the court. In her first two games this season, she has led the team in scoring (16 at Oklahoma, 23 at Stephen F. Austin) and is tied for the team lead in rebounds (13) and blocks (4). Dating back to last year, she has scored 13 or more points in nine straight games.

Jama Sharp ... Team Quarterback

Jama Sharp has had a great start as the team's point guard. She had 11 points and six assists at Oklahoma, and had 14 points and a career-high 10 assists at Stephen F. Austin. She is averaging a team-high 37.5 minutes per game.

Busy Stretch

The Hatters are playing their second game in as many days and are in a stretch of four games in six days in three different cities.

Sasha Sims Chasing School Points Record

Senior Sasha Sims is climbing the charts towards the school record for most career points. She currently ranks 15th in Stetson history with 1161 points. Sims is 409 points shy of tying the all-time Stetson points record-holder Michelle Michael (1570 points).

Senior Sasha Sims is just one of 13 players in Stetson history to record over 1000 points and 500 rebounds in a career, and she accomplished it in just three seasons.

Points in the Paint

The Hatters were 21-1 last season and are now 1-0 this season when outscoring its opponent in the paint.

Dominant at Home

The Hatters went 14-1 at home last season and are 30-2 in their last 32 home games dating back to February of 2011.

The Hatters Nickname

The unlikely combination of a famous hat manufacturer and a university produced a novel nickname for Stetson University. The athletic teams are called "Hatters," reflecting the university's association with John B. Stetson, maker of the well-known Stetson hats. It all began in 1883 when Henry DeLand founded the DeLand Academy. Three years later, after a disastrous freeze affecting the citrus industry left DeLand in financial distress, Stetson, who had a winter home in DeLand, became interested in the school. At DeLand's request, Stetson was made chairman of the Board of Trustees in 1889 and the university was renamed in his honor. Stetson University fielded the first football team in Florida in 1901. The name "Hatter" was used then and is still in use today.

6th Season at Stetson

A three-time Atlantic Sun Conference champion as a head coach, Lynn Bria enters her sixth season at the helm of Stetson women's basketball program.

In just the last three seasons Bria has turned the Hatters into a formidable force in the Atlantic Sun. She has guided the Hatters to two conference titles, two NCAA Tournament appearances, a WNIT bid, and three 20+ win seasons. In fact, Stetson is just one of three schools in the state of Florida to post over 65 victories since the start of the 2010-11 season.

The 2012-13 season was one for the history books as the Hatters set numerous team records and captured their second A-Sun title in the past three seasons. Bria helped lead the Hatters to a school-record 24 wins overall, a 12-1 record at home, a school-record 14 wins in A-Sun play, and winning streaks of 11 straight overall and 16 in a row at home. In the A-Sun Championship game, Stetson rallied from a 15-point second-half deficit to defeat top-seeded and previously undefeated FGCU 70-64, and then earned their highest-ever NCAA Tournament seed (14) and an appearance in the Columbus, Ohio regional against UCLA.

In 2011-12, the Hatters won a school-record 23 games and advanced to the postseason for the second year in a row, participating in the WNIT for the first time in school history. Three players earned All-Atlantic Sun honors including A-Sun Player of the Year and All-Tournament Team selection Victoria McGowan, who led the nation with three triple-doubles. Also honored were Second Team All-Atlantic Sun forward Sasha Sims and A-Sun All-Freshman Team forward Cherisse Burris.

Bria's 2010-11 Hatters won 20 games for the first time in 10 seasons, captured their third Atlantic Sun Conference tournament championship and advanced to the NCAA Tournament for the second time in school history and first time since 2005.

Stetson's turnaround under Bria from 6-24 to 20-13 (+12.5 games) was the second largest improvement in NCAA Division I women's basketball. Honors that came to members of the team included A-Sun Tournament MVP (Victoria McGowan), A-Sun All-Tournament Team (Tierra Brown, Sasha Sims), Second Team All-Atlantic Sun (McGowan), A-Sun All-Freshman Team (Sims), A-Sun Player of the Week (Natasha Graboski) and A-Sun Newcomer of the Week (McGowan twice, Sims). Graboski went on to sign a professional contract with Alexandria of Romania's Division 1 League in the summer of 2011.

In 2009-10 Bria led the Hatters to their seventh consecutive A-Sun tournament appearance. In her first season at Stetson, Bria made an immediate impact on the recruiting trail as her 2009-10 incoming class was ranked by Michael T. White's noted scouting service All-Star Girls Report as the best in the Atlantic Sun and in the top third of all NCAA Division I teams.

Bria has coached women's basketball for 20 years with 14 seasons of Division I head coaching experience to her credit at UCF, Ohio University and Stetson. In addition to coaching, she has extensive classroom experience at the university level and is committed to developing young women both athletically and academically.

Prior to joining the Hatters, Bria spent the previous two seasons as an assistant coach at top-level programs West Virginia (2006-07) and most recently the University of Miami. Her excellent recruiting skills led to the Hurricanes signing a Top 25 incoming class according to recruiting experts at www.HoopGurlz.com. With WVU, Bria served as recruiting coordinator in addition to her on-court coaching duties. Her leadership helped the Mountaineers achieve one of their best seasons in school history, which featured an at-large bid to and second round appearance in the NCAA Tournament as well as the second-largest turnaround in W-L record in Big East Conference history (15-16 to 21-11 overall and from 4-12 to 11-5 in Big East games).

From 1999-2006, Bria was the head coach at Ohio University in Athens, Ohio. She also led UCF for three seasons from 1996-99. Her final Golden Knights team in 1998-99 was the TAAC (now Atlantic Sun) regular season and tournament champions and appeared in the NCAA Tournament. Her first head coaching position came at Division II Texas Woman's University in Denton, Texas for three seasons from 1993-96.

A standout performer for the Charleston Golden Eagles, the Class of 1990 graduate was inducted into her alma mater's Athletic Hall of Fame in 2003. She scored 1,146 points in her career, averaging 10.3 points per game and was a 75.3 percent free throw shooter over her career.

Preseason Accolades

The Stetson University women's basketball team was picked to finish second in the 2013-14 Atlantic Sun Conference preseason coaches poll. Senior **Sasha Sims** was tabbed as the Atlantic Sun Preseason Defensive Player of the Year, and she was also selected to the preseason all-conference team. Last season, Sims averaged 12.0 points, 4.1 rebounds, and 1.6 blocks per game and earned second-team all-conference honors. Sims averaged better than 17 points per game during the Atlantic Sun Championship and was named to the all-tournament team. She has already surpassed 1000 points for her career and is just 16 blocks shy of breaking the school-record in that category.
