News and Notes

Preview

Stetson completes its two-game road trip in Tallahassee, Fla. with a Monday night contest at Florida A&M. The Hatters (3-3) are coming off a 79-49 setback at Florida State on Friday. Tip-off is set for 6:00 p.m. at the Al Lawson Center.

The All-Time Series vs. FAMU

Florida A&M leads the all-time series 31-7 over Stetson, but the Hatters won 88-67 last year in DeLand. The Lady Rattlers also lead the series 16-2 in games played in Tallahassee, including the last seven in a row. The Hatters last won at Florida A&M in 1990.

Mid-Major Top 25

Both Stetson (16 votes) and Florida A&M (5 votes) are receiving votes in the Collegeinsider. com Mid-Major Top 25 poll (Nov. 26).

Road Warriors

Tonight marks the Hatters' seventh overall game this season, and their sixth on the road. However, the Hatters will play four of their next five and six of their next eight at home.

Five in Double Figures

After six games the Hatters still maintain five players averaging double figures in scoring - Sasha Sims (20.7), Brianti Saunders (12.2), Cherisse Burris (10.3), Amber Porter (10.0), and Jama Sharp (10.0).

Getting to the Line

Stetson has done a great job of getting to the free throw line this season. Stetson has shot 155 free throws, an average of over 25 per game. The Hatters are shooting 72.3% from the free throw line (112-155).

Sasha Sims Leading the Team

As the lone senior on the team, Sasha Sims has been leading the team both on and off the court. She has led the team in scoring in each of the first six games this season: 16 at Oklahoma, 23 at Stephen F. Austin, 17 vs. North Carolina A&T, 24 vs. Indiana State, a careerhigh 28 at Bethune-Cookman, and 16 at Florida State. Her scoring average of 20.7 ranks second in the A-Sun and 36th in the NCAA. Coach Bria describes Sims as the most versatile player in the conference and this season she is using "everything in her cupboard."

Jama Sharp Quarterbacking the Team

Coach Bria has said that Jama Sharp is the quarterback of the team and nothing happens without her. Sharp has delivered so far in her first season as the team's point guard, compiling 37 assists in the first six games. She had two 10 assist games (at Stephen F. Austin and vs. North Carolina A&T), and 6.2 apg average ranks second in the A-Sun and 12th in the NCAA. She is also averaging 10.0 points and a team-high 36.3 minutes per game.

Brianti Saunders Fueling the Team

With the departure of 53% of the team's scoring from last season, the Hatters are going to need their freshmen to contribute, and so far Amber Porter and Brianti Saunders have stepped up early in the season. Saunders ranks second on the team in scoring (12.2) and rebounding (6.3), third in minutes (32.8), and she leads the team in three-point field goals (13). She has scored in double figures in five of the six games, had a double-double (12-10) vs. North Carolina A&T, and went for 18 and 9 at Bethune-Cookman on Nov. 20.

Amber Porter Impacting the Team

Amber Porter is also making quite an impact in her freshman campaign. Porter is averaging 10.0 points, 4.8 rebounds, and 2.2 blocks per game through the first six five games. She owns the eighth highest field goal pct. in the A-Sun (.511) and the fourth-highest blocks total (13). Porter has at least one block in all six games, including a season-best four at Florida State on Friday.

Hefty Travel

The Hatters traveled over 3,600 miles over the first two weekends of the season to play in three Preseason WNIT games. However, Stetson is now playing a stretch of 12 straight games in the state of Florida. The Hatters do not leave the state again until a Jan. 16 game at Mercer (Macon, Ga.)

The Hatters Nickname

The unlikely combination of a famous hat manufacturer and a university produced a novel nickname for Stetson University. The athletic teams are called "Hatters," reflecting the university's association with John B. Stetson, maker of the well-known Stetson hats. It all began in 1883 when Henry DeLand founded the DeLand Academy. Three years later, after a disastrous freeze affecting the citrus industry left DeLand in financial distress, Stetson, who had a winter home in DeLand, became interested in the school. At Deland's request, Stetson was made chairman of the Board of Trustees in 1889 and the university was renamed in

his honor. Stetson University fielded the first football team in Florida in 1901. The name "Hatter" was used then and is still in use today.

A-Sun Preseason Polls

Preseason Accolades

The Stetson University women's basketball team was picked to finish second in the 2013-14 Atlantic Sun Conference preseason coaches poll. Senior Sasha Sims was tabbed as the Atlantic Sun Preseason Defensive Player of the Year, and she was also selected to the preseason all-conference team. Last season, Sims averaged 12.0 points, 4.1 rebounds, and 1.6 blocks per game and earned secondteam all-conference honors. Sims averaged better than 17 points per game during the Atlantic Sun Championship and was named to the all-tournament team. She has already surpassed 1000 points for her career and is just 16 blocks shy of breaking the schoolrecord in that category.

Sasha Sims Chasing School Points Record

Senior Sasha Sims is climbing the charts towards the school record for most career points. She currently ranks 11th in Stetson history with 1246 points. Sims is 324 points shy of tying the all-time Stetson points record-holder Michael (1570 points).

Points in the Paint Matter

The Hatters were 21-1 last season and are now 3-0 this season when outscoring its opponent in the paint.

Three-Year Success Part I (Overall)

The Hatters have experienced quite a bit of success over the past three seasons, including:

- Three 20+ win seasons
- Three postseason appearances (2 NCAA, 1 WNIT)
- Two Atlantic Sun Conference Championships
- Three appearances in the Atlantic Sun Championship game

Three-Year Success Part II (State of Florida)

Since the start of the 2010-11 season, the Hatters have compiled a 70-35 record (.667). Only two other teams in the state of Florida have more wins than Stetson during that stretch: Florida Gulf Coast (88) and Miami (80). Only Stetson, FGCU, Miami, and Florida have won 20+ games in each of the past three seasons.

Three-Year Success Part III (Atlantic Sun)

Over the past three seasons, Stetson is 39-17 (.696) in Atlantic Sun regular season games and 8-1 in A-Sun tournament games. The Hatters have reached the A-Sun Championship game all three years, winning it twice (2011, 2013).

Roster Turnover

The Hatters graduated six seniors off of last year's squad and have welcomed seven newcomers to the program. Among the graduates were Atlantic Sun Conference first-team all-conference selections Victoria McGowan (15.9 ppg) and Shanasa Sanders (13.8 ppg). In all, Stetson lost 53% of its scoring from a year ago, and 55% of its rebounding.

Fall Signees

In the fall signing period, the Hatters welcomed **Keevana Edwards** (Atlanta, Ga./Wesleyan School), **Lashai Geeter** (Detroit, Mich./Martin Luther King Jr. Senior HS), and **Sarah Sagerer** (Vocklabruck, Austria/The Rock School) to the program.

Sasha Sims, Brianti Saunders Sweep A-Sun Weekly Awards

Quickly becoming one of the top scoring tandems in the Atlantic Sun Conference, senior Sasha Sims and rookie Brianti Saunders swept the league's Player of the Week and Freshman of the Week awards on Nov. 25. The duo combined for 85 of the team's 167 points as the Hatters claimed a pair of victories over Indiana State and Bethune-Cookman. Sims scored 24 points against the Sycamores and poured in a career-high 28 points on the road against the Lady Wildcats. Saunders, meanwhile, earned the league's Freshman of the Week award for the second consecutive week, scoring 15 points against Indiana State and a career-high 18 points at Bethune-Cookman.

A three-time Atlantic Sun Conference champion as a head coach, Lynn Bria is in her sixth season at the helm of Stetson women's basketball program.

In just the last three seasons Bria has turned the Hatters into a formidable force in the Atlantic Sun. She has guided the Hatters to two conference titles, two NCAA Tournament appearances, a WNIT bid, and three 20+ win seasons. In fact, Stetson is just one of three schools in the state of Florida to post over 65 victories since the start of the 2010-11 season.

The 2012-13 season was one for the history books as the Hatters set numerous team records and captured their second A-Sun title in the past three seasons. Bria helped lead the Hatters to a school-record 24 wins overall, a 12-1 record at home, a school-record 14 wins in A-Sun play, and winning streaks of 11 straight overall and 16 in a row at home. In the A-Sun Championship game, Stetson rallied from a 15-point second-half deficit to defeat top-seeded and previously undefeated FGCU 70-64, and then earned their highest-ever NCAA Tournament seed (14) and an appearance in the Columbus, Ohio regional against UCLA.

In 2011-12, the Hatters won a school-record 23 games and advanced to the postseason for the second year in a row, participating in the WNIT for the first time in school history. Three players earned All-Atlantic Sun honors including A-Sun Player of the Year and All-Tournament Team selection Victoria McGowan, who led the nation with three triple-doubles. Also honored were Second Team All-Alantic Sun forward Sasha Sims and A-Sun All-Freshman Team forward Cherisse Burris.

Bria's 2010-11 Hatters won 20 games for the first time in 10 seasons, captured their third Atlantic Sun Conference tournament championship and advanced to the NCAA Tournament for the second time in school history and first time since 2005.

Stetson's turnaround under Bria from 6-24 to 20-13 (+12.5 games) was the second largest improvement in NCAA Division I women's basketball. Honors that came to members of the team included A-Sun Tournament MVP (Victoria McGowan), A-Sun All-Tournament Team (Tierra Brown, Sasha Sims), Second Team All-Atlantic Sun (McGowan), A-Sun All-Freshman Team (Sims), A-Sun Player of the Week (Natasha Graboski) and A-Sun Newcomer of the Week (McGowan twice, Sims). Graboski went on to sign a professional contract with Alexandria of Romania's Division 1 League in the summer of 2011.

In 2009-10 Bria led the Hatters to their seventh consecutive A-Sun tournament appearance. In her first season at Stetson, Bria made an immediate impact on the recruiting trail as her 2009-10 incoming class was ranked by Michael T. White's noted scouting service All-Star Girls Report as the best in the Atlantic Sun and in the top third of all NCAA Division I teams.

Bria has coached women's basketball for 20 years with 14 seasons of Division I head coaching experience to her credit at UCF, Ohio University and Stetson. In addition to coaching, she has extensive classroom experience at the university level and is committed to developing young women both athletically and academically.

Prior to joining the Hatters, Bria spent the previous two seasons as an assistant coach at top-level programs West Virginia (2006-07) and most recently the University of Miami. Her excellent recruiting skills led to the Hurricanes signing a Top 25 incoming class according to recruiting experts at www.HoopGurlz.com. With WVU, Bria served as recruiting coordinator in addition to her on-court coaching duties. Her leadership helped the Mountaineers achieve one of their best seasons in school history, which featured an at-large bid to and second round appearance in the NCAA Tournament as well as the second-largest turnaround in W-L record in Big East Conference history (15-16 to 21-11 overall and from 4-12 to 11-5 in Big East games).

From 1999-2006, Bria was the head coach at Ohio University in Athens, Ohio. She also led UCF for three seasons from 1996-99. Her final Golden Knights team in 1998-99 was the TAAC (now Atlantic Sun) regular season and tournament champions and appeared in the NCAA Tournament. Her first head coaching position came at Division II Texas Woman's University in Denton, Texas for three seasons from 1993-96.

A standout performer for the Charleston Golden Eagles, the Class of 1990 graduate was inducted into her alma mater's Athletic Hall of Fame in 2003. She scored 1,146 points in her career, averaging 10.3 points per game and was a 75.3 percent free throw shooter over her career.

Coach Bria: "I thought we were better from our last game. If we get better every game, we are going to be OK. We rebounded the ball much better and we just had a lot more effort on the glass. Austin came back and cut the lead and we could have folded, but we made some plays down the stretch and I was really proud of our kids.



Stetson fell 73-68 to North Carolina A&T to close the Preseason WNIT. The Hatters shot 54.5 percent from the floor, but committed 26 turnovers and surrendered 17 offensive rebounds to the Aggies. Stetson trailed by four at halftime but used an 8-0 run out of the locker room to take a 45-41 lead. The Hatters still led by four at the 11:36 mark, but the Aggies fought back and built a five-point lead with under four minutes to play. Stetson closed the gap to one down the stretch but would pull no closer.

Coach Bria: "We didn't execute offensively the entire second half. (North Carolina A&T) did a really good job, their defense is hard to play against, but we just threw the ball away. We had entirely too many turnovers, and we gave up entirely too many rebounds. When you turn the ball over and you are not rebounding, you are probably not going to win."

However, our main goal is to be a good team in January and February, and we just have to keep improving."

An early 14-0 run by Florida State put the Hatters down early, but Stetson climbed back to within nine at halftime and to within six early in the second half. However, the Hatters would connect on just six field goals the rest of the way.

Coach Bria: "In the first half I thought we played as tough as anyone could against them. I thought for the first six minutes we just weren't used to their size. We couldn't see and we turned the ball over, and that hurt us. In the second half we scored early, but they went on a run and we just couldn't score. They wore us down a little bit inside."
