News and Notes

Preview

Following an eight-day layoff for final exams, the Stetson women's basketball team returns to the court to face the Charlotte 49ers in the first game of a three-game homestand. Tip-off is scheduled for 5 p.m. in the opening game of a men's and women's basketball doubleheader.

The All-Time Series vs. Charlotte

Today will mark the all-time third meeting between Stetson and Charlotte. The teams met in Tallahassee in a tournament as Florida State in 1989, and again last year in Charlotte. The 49ers won both meetings (81-73 last year).

Quick Hitters: Team News and Notes

- Stetson has won four of its last six games and five of its last eight.
- Stetson leads the A-Sun in scoring (76.7), field goal pct. (.443), and assists (15.6)
- Stetson is 5-0 this season when outrebounding its opponent.
- Stetson needs one win to tie its highest four-year combined victory total (73).

Quick Hatters: Individual News and Notes

- Sasha Sims is tied for ninth in school history in points scored (1285).
- Sasha Sims and Brianti Saunders are the top scoring duo in the Atlantic Sun (33.9 ppg).

Notes from the Last Three Games

Over the last three games:

- Stetson is averaging 87.3 points scored and 62.0 points allowed per game
- Stetson is shooting 49.5% from the floor and 39.7% from three-point range
- Stetson is averaging 51.7 rebounds and 18.0 assists per game
- Brianti Saunders is averaging 23.0 points and is 10-for-22 from behind the arc
- Amber Porter is averaging 18.0 points, 12.7 rebounds, and 6.7 blocks per game
- Cherisse Burris is averaging 10.0 points, 10.3 rebounds, and is shooting 63.2% (12-for-19)
- Jama Sharp is averaging 12.3 points, 6.7 assists, and 6.0 rebounds (6-for-12 3-pt FG)
- Sasha Sims is averaging 13.0 points and 4.7 rebounds
- C.J. Coddington is shooting 75% (3-4) from behind the arc and 100% (4-4) from the line
- The team has five double-doubles (Porter-2, Burris-2, Sharp-1)

Block Party

In Stetson's win over Palm Beach Atlantic, freshman Amber Porter tied the school single-game record with eight blocks against the Sailfish. She also recorded six blocks against USF on Dec. 8 and has 24 blocks in her last four games. She ranks second in the A-Sun and sixth in the nation in blocks per game (3.7) and has at least one block in all nine games this season.

Home Sweet Home Finally

After playing seven of their first nine games on the road, the Hatters are opening a three-game homestand and a stretch of five out of six games at home.

Dominant at Home

The Hatters have won 20 of their last 21 home games and are 32-2 in their last 34 games at the Edmunds Center dating back to February of 2011 (both losses to Florida Gulf Coast). Stetson has also won 14 straight non-conference home games.

Five in Double Figures

After eight games the Hatters "starting five" are all averaging double figures in scoring - Sasha Sims (18.1), Brianti Saunders (15.8), Amber Porter (12.7), Jama Sharp (10.8), and Cherisse Burris (10.2). Stetson is the only team in the Atlantic Sun with five players averaging double figures in scoring.

Brianti Saunders, Amber Porter Sweep A-Sun Weekly Awards

The Hatters' freshman duo of Brianti Saunders and Amber Porter swept the Atlantic Sun Conference Player and Newcomer of the Week awards on Dec. 9. Saunders averaged 23.0 points and shot over 54 percent from the field in a 2-1 week for Stetson. She scored 30 points on 11-of-15 shooting in a 35-point road win at Florida A&M. Porter, meanwhile, averaged 18.0 points, 12.7 rebounds, and 6.7 blocks per game. She registered a 23-point, 15-rebound, six-block performance at Florida A&M, then equaled and surpassed those totals in a 23-point, 17-rebound, eight-block outing vs. Palm Beach Atlantic. The eight blocks tied a school single-game record and was the highest total for an A-Sun Player since 2008.

The Hatters Nickname

The unlikely combination of a famous hat manufacturer and a university produced a novel nickname for Stetson University. The athletic teams are called "Hatters," reflecting the university's association with John B. Stetson, maker of the well-known Stetson hats. It all began in 1883 when Henry DeLand founded the DeLand Academy. Three years later, after a disastrous freeze affecting the citrus industry left DeLand in financial distress, Stetson, who had a winter home in DeLand, became interested in the school. At DeLand's request, Stetson was made chairman of the Board of Trustees in 1889 and the university was renamed in his honor. Stetson University fielded the first football team in Florida in 1901. The name "Hatter" was used then and is still in use today.



A-Sun Preseason Polls

Preseason Accolades

The Stetson University women's basketball team was picked to finish second in the 2013-14 Atlantic Sun Conference preseason coaches poll. Senior **Sasha Sims** was tabbed as the Atlantic Sun Preseason Defensive Player of the Year, and she was also selected to the preseason all-conference team. Last season, Sims averaged 12.0 points, 4.1 rebounds, and 1.6 blocks per game and earned second-team all-conference honors. Sims averaged better than 17 points per game during the Atlantic Sun Championship and was named to the all-tournament team. She has already surpassed 1000 points for her career and is just 16 blocks shy of breaking the school-record in that category.

News and Notes

Sasha Sims Leading the Team

As the lone senior on the team, Sasha Sims has been leading the team both on and off the court. She led the team in scoring in each of the team's first six games this season, including a career-high 28 points at Bethune-Cookman. Her scoring average of 18.1 ranks second in the A-Sun, and she has scored in double figures in 16 straight games dating back to last year.

Jama Sharp With 10 Assists x3

Three times this season, Jama Sharp has recorded 10 assists in a game (vs. Stephen F. Austin, North Carolina A&T, and Florida A&M). She ranks second in the A-Sun with 57 assists and she leads the team with 34.8 minutes per game.

Early Season Travel

The Hatters traveled over 3,600 miles over the first two weekends of the season to play in three Preseason WNIT games. However, Stetson is now playing a stretch of 12 straight games in the state of Florida. The Hatters do not leave the state again until a Jan. 16 game at Mercer (Macon, Ga.)

Sasha Sims Chasing School Points Record

Senior Sasha Sims is climbing the charts towards the school record for most career points. She currently ranks 11th in Stetson history with 1259 points. Sims is 1 point shy of cracking the top 10 all-time scorers in Stetson history.

Points in the Paint Matter

The Hatters were 21-1 last season and are now 5-0 this season when outscoring its opponent in the paint.

Best Four-Year Records

Since the start of the 2010-11 season, the Hatters have won 72 games, the second-highest four-year win total in Stetson women's basketball history. Last year's senior class owns the all-time record with 73 wins from 2009-10 through 2012-13:

1. 73 wins 2009-10 through 2012-13
2. **72 wins 2010-11 through Present**
3. 68 wins 1985-86 through 1988-89

Atlantic Sun Statistical Leaders

The Hatters currently lead the Atlantic Sun in scoring (76.7), scoring margin (+6.7), field goal percentage (.443), and assists (15.6). Stetson also ranks second in rebounding (43.6) and blocks (5.2) and third three-point field goals made (6.3). Individually, Brianti Saunders leads the league in three-point FG made (23) and three-point FG made/game (2.6).

A three-time Atlantic Sun Conference champion as a head coach, Lynn Bria is in her sixth season at the helm of Stetson women's basketball program.

In just the last three seasons Bria has turned the Hatters into a formidable force in the Atlantic Sun. She has guided the Hatters to two conference titles, two NCAA Tournament appearances, a WNIT bid, and three 20+ win seasons. In fact, Stetson is just one of three schools in the state of Florida to post over 65 victories since the start of the 2010-11 season.

The 2012-13 season was one for the history books as the Hatters set numerous team records and captured their second A-Sun title in the past three seasons. Bria helped lead the Hatters to a school-record 24 wins overall, a 12-1 record at home, a school-record 14 wins in A-Sun play, and winning streaks of 11 straight overall and 16 in a row at home. In the A-Sun Championship game, Stetson rallied from a 15-point second-half deficit to defeat top-seeded and previously undefeated FGCU 70-64, and then earned their highest-ever NCAA Tournament seed (14) and an appearance in the Columbus, Ohio regional against UCLA.

In 2011-12, the Hatters won a school-record 23 games and advanced to the postseason for the second year in a row, participating in the WNIT for the first time in school history. Three players earned All-Atlantic Sun honors including A-Sun Player of the Year and All-Tournament Team selection Victoria McGowan, who led the nation with three triple-doubles. Also honored were Second Team All-Atlantic Sun forward Sasha Sims and A-Sun All-Freshman Team forward Cherisse Burris.

Bria's 2010-11 Hatters won 20 games for the first time in 10 seasons, captured their third Atlantic Sun Conference tournament championship and advanced to the NCAA Tournament for the second time in school history and first time since 2005.

Stetson's turnaround under Bria from 6-24 to 20-13 (+12.5 games) was the second largest improvement in NCAA Division I women's basketball. Honors that came to members of the team included A-Sun Tournament MVP (Victoria McGowan), A-Sun All-Tournament Team (Tierra Brown, Sasha Sims), Second Team All-Atlantic Sun (McGowan), A-Sun All-Freshman Team (Sims), A-Sun Player of the Week (Natasha Graboski) and A-Sun Newcomer of the Week (McGowan twice, Sims). Graboski went on to sign a professional contract with Alexandria of Romania's Division 1 League in the summer of 2011.

In 2009-10 Bria led the Hatters to their seventh consecutive A-Sun tournament appearance. In her first season at Stetson, Bria made an immediate impact on the recruiting trail as her 2009-10 incoming class was ranked by Michael T. White's noted scouting service All-Star Girls Report as the best in the Atlantic Sun and in the top third of all NCAA Division I teams.

Bria has coached women's basketball for 20 years with 14 seasons of Division I head coaching experience to her credit at UCF, Ohio University and Stetson. In addition to coaching, she has extensive classroom experience at the university level and is committed to developing young women both athletically and academically.

Prior to joining the Hatters, Bria spent the previous two seasons as an assistant coach at top-level programs West Virginia (2006-07) and most recently the University of Miami. Her excellent recruiting skills led to the Hurricanes signing a Top 25 incoming class according to recruiting experts at www.HoopGurlz.com. With WVU, Bria served as recruiting coordinator in addition to her on-court coaching duties. Her leadership helped the Mountaineers achieve one of their best seasons in school history, which featured an at-large bid to and second round appearance in the NCAA Tournament as well as the second-largest turnaround in W-L record in Big East Conference history (15-16 to 21-11 overall and from 4-12 to 11-5 in Big East games).

From 1999-2006, Bria was the head coach at Ohio University in Athens, Ohio. She also led UCF for three seasons from 1996-99. Her final Golden Knights team in 1998-99 was the TAAC (now Atlantic Sun) regular season and tournament champions and appeared in the NCAA Tournament. Her first head coaching position came at Division II Texas Woman's University in Denton, Texas for three seasons from 1993-96.

A standout performer for the Charleston Golden Eagles, the Class of 1990 graduate was inducted into her alma mater's Athletic Hall of Fame in 2003. She scored 1,146 points in her career, averaging 10.3 points per game and was a 75.3 percent free throw shooter over her career.
